In my opinion, they are all gems and personal favorites. Most of the tunes you will hear played at sessions all over this world. Some are relatively unknown and you will increase their value by your playing them. That's the way the tradition works – good tunes spread quickly and far like wild fires. And there are some hot tunes within these pages. Thanks to all who authored them and shared them with us.

We have come a long way since we had our first O'Flaherty Irish Music Retreat on October 30-31, 2004, in Richardson, Texas. We've moved to Midlothian, Texas to Camp Hoblitzelle to enable us to grow, and grow we have. It remains a tribute to Jim O'Flaherty who moved to America from Listowel, Ireland when he was 18 and ultimately made his way to Texas bringing his love of traditional Irish music with him. Jim, his wife and ten kids, opened their home to many of the area musicians for sessions and potluck. A number of tunes that we played at those wonderful sessions in the '80s are in this tunebook. Jim is no longer with us, but his encouragement for learning the music remains.

I want to thank the people who helped produce this tunebook: **Rick Roberts** for his mastery of ABCs and tune research in preparing the pages; **Kevin Alewine** for helping with the chording of the tunes; and **Emily Bryant** for creating the cover art. And lastly, I want to thank my family – **Peggy, Katie and Kevin** -- for letting me do "labors of love" like this.

The O'Flaherty Irish Music Retreat is produced by the Traditional Irish Music Education Society (TIMES), a non-profit corporation based in Richardson, Texas. The organization's purpose is to be a resource for those wanting to learn and play traditional Irish music, and this tunebook is one example of our work.
